Honoring Chief Kenneth A. Coontz upon his retirement from the Mansfield Division of Police.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That this Council, on behalf of the government and the citizens of the Mansfield community, is privileged to honor and pay tribute to Chief Coontz upon his retirement, effective April 5, 2019, after more than twenty-six (26) years of service with the Mansfield Division of Police.

Chief Coontz began his law enforcement career with the Division of Police on September 21, 1993, and was promoted to Sergeant on February 14, 2005, to Lieutenant on June 25, 2009, to Captain on May 6, 2013 and to the Chief of Police on December 18, 2013. He served in numerous capacities within the Division including Patrol, Watch Commander, Community Policing, Neighborhood Impact Section, K-9 Officer/Handler, Traffic Unit Sergeant, Section Commander for Special Investigations, and Commander for METRICH Enforcement Unit, comprised of ten counties in north central Ohio.


During his tenure as Chief of Police, he implemented a community policing philosophy within the department that centered on strengthening police and community relationships as well as improving youth mentoring and programming. The Mansfield Division of Police reduced overall Part One Crimes to its lowest point in over a decade. The department also formed the Richland County Opiate Board and Quick Response Team. Chief Coontz formed a community team that consisted of officers, City Council members, and community leaders to create Mansfield's "Focused Deterrence Board" to reduce violent gun crimes. METRICH drug operations were reconstructed to better focus on Drug Trafficking Organizations (DTO's) in order to have a significant impact on drugs in the community.


He was involved in the community and worked with several community programs and agencies including the Ohio Task Force Commanders Association Executive Board, YMCA Executive Board, Community Action for Capable Youth Executive Board, Big Brothers Executive Board, International Association of Chiefs of Police, Ohio Crime Prevention Association, Ohio Chief of Police Association, and the Richland County Chiefs Association. He also coached baseball and basketball for local youth and school teams.


Chief Coontz has received 23 Special Commendations, was presented the VFW Life Saving Award, Supervisor of the Year, received two Top Cop Awards, Legion of Merit Award, Military Service Ribbon, K-9 Handler Service Ribbon, presented with the 2017 NAACP Community Award, and received numerous letters of recognition and support from outside law enforcement agencies. Chief Coontz's retirement represents a loss to the Mansfield Division of Police and culminates a career that has exemplified the best qualities of a law enforcement executive. He has our congratulations upon his retirement and our heartfelt thanks for his many years of loyal service to the community. We wish him the greatest success and happiness in the future.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:


SECTION 1. That the Public Works Director be, and he is hereby, authorized to advertise for bids and to enter into a contract with the lowest and best bidder according to law for furnishing salt requirements of the City according to specifications now on file, for use during the 2019-2020 winter season.

SECTION 2. That the cost of materials purchased hereunder shall be paid from the proper appropriated funds.

SECTION 3. That by reason of the immediate need to bid and contract for delivery of salt supply at a time when salt prices are most competitive and in advance of the 2019-2020 winter weather, this measure is determined to be an emergency ordinance for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Mansfield and its inhabitants and providing it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect be in force immediately upon its adoption, otherwise from and after the earliest time allowed by law, after its passage and approval by the Mayor.





Granting a license to Cypress Hill Winery Hudson and Essex Restaurant, 51 East Fourth Street, Mansfield, Ohio, to use the public right-of-way for the installation of steps, accessibility ramp, and canopy, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That Cypress Hill Winery Hudson and Essex Restaurant, 51 East Fourth Street, Mansfield, Ohio, be, and it is hereby, granted a license to install steps, accessibility ramp and canopy in the public right-of-way on East Fourth Street immediately along the side of their building, all in accordance with plans and specifications now on file with the City Engineer.

SECTION 2. That the license and right granted in Section 1 shall be subject to the following conditions:


- A. That the cost of the construction, its erection and maintenance and any and all expense incident thereto shall be at the expense of the Licensee.






