RESOLUTION # \_\_\_\_\_

A Resolution strongly urging the Ohio governor and members of the Ohio general assembly to restore the local government fund to pre-recession levels, and declaring an emergency.

**WHEREAS**, the Local Government Fund was reduced in 2011 by 50% during the Kasich Administration, from 3.68% of General Revenue Funds to its current level of 1.66% of General Revenue Funds; and

**WHEREAS**, past Ohio General Assemblies have repeatedly decreased funding and revenue sharing in recent years in addition to significantly reducing the Local Government Fund, including eliminating the Estate Tax and phasing out the Tangible Personal Property Tax; and

**WHEREAS**, these reductions have resulted in an estimated loss of revenue through 2018 based on the five-year average collections prior to reductions, phase-outs, and eliminations of \$16,091,830; and

**WHEREAS**, this sudden revenue loss has made it increasingly difficult to provide basic services, rebuild infrastructure, and bolster public safety services to fight the opioid epidemic; and

**WHEREAS**, when municipalities experience success in fostering safe communities, building sound infrastructure, and increasing economic development, the State of Ohio reaps the benefits as well.

**WHEREAS**, a reinvestment of Local Government Fund would aid the state in its goal of lowering taxes on the individual by enabling municipalities to decrease the local tax burden.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:**

SECTION 1. The Ohio General Assembly should restore the Local Government Fund to pre-recession levels, ensuring that these local communities are able to provide crucial services and improvements in infrastructure and public safety.


SECTION 2. This Council does hereby declare its opposition to any further cuts to the Local Government Fund or the future diversion of revenues from the Local Government Fund.

SECTION 3. That the Clerk of Council is hereby authorized and directed to forward a certified copy of this Resolution to the Mansfield area's duly elected State Representative, Mark J. Romanchuk, and also forward a certified copy of this Resolution to the Mansfield area's duly elected State Senator, Larry Obhof, and also forward a certified copy to the Ohio Municipal League.

SECTION 4. That this Resolution shall take effect immediately.





Authorizing payment of the claim of Libby Cleaver, 630 Weller Avenue, Mansfield, Ohio and declaring an emergency.

**WHEREAS**, a claim has been filed against the City of Mansfield by Libby Cleaver for damage to a mailbox allegedly caused by a city truck, and

**WHEREAS**, upon investigation by City employees and others and discussions and negotiations with the claimant, the Claims Committee of City Council has recommended payment of said claim upon the terms hereinafter set forth.





Authorizing payment to Standard Plumbing and Heating Company in the amount of five thousand one hundred five and 46/100 dollars (\$5,105.46) by affirming a Then and Now Certificate of the Finance Director, and declaring an emergency.

**WHEREAS**, the Ocie Hill Center Department, contracted services replacing and repairing plumbing at Ocie Hill Neighborhood Center prior to submission of a purchase order therefor to the Finance Department in the amount of five thousand one hundred five and 46/100 dollars (\$5,105.46), and

**WHEREAS**, R.C. 5705.41(D)(1) provides that the payment of three thousand dollars or more on a contract or order made by a municipality without a certificate of available funds being attached at such time must be authorized by the legislative authority after the fiscal officer subsequently certifies that the funds were available at the time the contract or order was made and that such funds are still available.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:**

SECTION 1. That this Council does hereby affirm the Then and Now Certificate issued by the Finance Director relating to the request and receipt by the Ocie Hill Center Department for contracted services replacing and repairing plumbing at Ocie Hill Neighborhood Center prior to a purchase order therefor being submitted to the Finance Department, and authorize the Finance Director to issue her warrant to the Standard Plumbing and Heating Company in the amount of five thousand one hundred five and 46/100 dollars (\$5,105.46) from funds heretofore appropriated in the General Fund (#101).

SECTION 2. That reason of the immediate need to authorize payment of this obligation within thirty days after receipt of the certificate of the Finance Director per R.C. 5705.41(D)(1), this measure is determined to be an emergency Ordinance for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Mansfield and its inhabitants and providing it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately after its passage, otherwise from and after the earliest time allowed by law, after its passage and approval by the Mayor.


Establishing new Capital Projects Fund #424, entitled "Water Meter Improvement Fund," to account for bond proceeds to renovate, improve, and increase the capacity of the City's Water Meter Improvement Fund for the acquisition and installation of water meters and related equipment for the City's water system, and declaring an emergency.


**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:**


SECTION 1. That new Capital Projects Fund #424, entitled "Water Meter Improvement Fund" be established to account for \$13,300,000 in bond proceeds to renovate, improve, and increase the capacity of the City's water system by installation of water meters and related equipment with an estimated project time period of eighteen months.

SECTION 2. To effectively and properly administer expenditures of the bond proceeds and begin improving the City's Water Meter Improvement Fund, this measure is determined to be an emergency Ordinance for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Mansfield and its inhabitants and providing it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its adoption, otherwise from and after the earliest time allowed by law, after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
