SECTION 3. That a copy of this Ordinance shall be served upon the claimant at the time of the delivery of said warrant.



Authorizing the Safety-Service Director to accept and appropriate funding from the United States Department of Justice (DOJ) Federal Bureau of Justice Assistance in the amount of seventy-two thousand five hundred seven dollars (\$72,507) to offset costs associated with COVID-19, incurred by the Mansfield Police Department, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, Subgrant Number 2020-VD-BX-0552 awarded to the City under the Corona Virus Emergency Supplemental Funding (CESF) Grant Program will provide funds to offset costs for Overtime, Equipment, and Supplies, and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City of Mansfield, Ohio, to avail itself of the opportunities provided by this program and to participate with complete commitment.

General Assumptions
